Dear Chair Cole, Ranking Member DeLauro, Chair Amodei and Ranking Member Cuellar:

Thank you for your continued support for the Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA) Nonprofit Security Grant Program (NSGP). As the Fiscal Year 2025 (FY2025) Department of Homeland Security (DHS) appropriations bill is drafted, we respectfully ask that \$385 million of funding be allocated for NSGP. It is well known that the program provides critical security resources to at-risk faith-based and nonprofit institutions located in urban, suburban, and rural communities.

The security investments acquired through the NSGP program include physical security enhancements, emergency preparedness planning, training exercises, and enhanced engagement and collaboration between public and private community representatives, as well as state and local homeland security and emergency management government agencies. The investments are pivotal to our national security, as DHS recognized the serious nature of the threats in its National Terrorism Advisory System Bulletins, which warns that acts of extremist-motivated violence are likely to continue against faith-based institutions, schools, and racial and religious minorities. Notably, the most recent bulletin signaled an increased threat landscape since Hamas brutally attacked Israel on October 7, 2023, alerting that extremists have called for violence and celebrated attacks against the Jewish community. It continued, warning that lone actors could seek to disrupt or escalate violence at religious locations, with Jewish, Christian, Muslim, and Arab communities as potential targets¹. There has also been an increase in hoax bomb and active shooter threats targeting houses of worship across the country, intended to disrupt services and intimidate congregants.

In the three months following October 7, the Anti-Defamation League (ADL) recorded an alarming 3,291 antisemitic incidents across the United States – an average of 34 anti-Jewish acts daily, and a 360% increase in antisemitic incident reports. Nationwide reporting on specific incidents underscores the frequency, complexity, and breadth of the threats our religious communities face:

• On March 26, 2023, the Sacramento County Sheriff's Office reported a shooting of two individuals outside a Sikh Temple following a physical altercation.²

- On March 27, 2023, a woman entered a Nashville, Tennessee, Christian elementary school and shot and killed six people, of which three were children.³
- On July 31, 2023, a man opened fire outside a Jewish school in Memphis, Tennessee.⁴
- On December 7, 2023, a man in Albany, New York, fired a shotgun twice outside of a synagogue just hours before the start of Hanukkah.⁵
- More than a dozen synagogues in greater Philadelphia received bomb threats on the last day of Hanukkah, prompting evacuations and mass law enforcement responses.⁶
- On January 3, 2024, a Newark, New Jersey, Imam was shot and killed outside of his mosque.⁷
- On January 30, 2024, a man open fired at a San Franciso Catholic Church.⁸
- On February 11, 2024, a woman forced her way inside a Texas Christian megachurch and open fired.⁹
- On February 17, 2024, police in Broward County, Florida, arrested a man for beating a 69-year-old Rabbi who was walking home from synagogue on Shabbat.¹⁰

The NSGP program is a critical component to the nation's response to domestic and international threats targeting the nonprofit sector, but the program is significantly over-subscribed. The most recent NSGP award results made that clear. According to FEMA's data, it reviewed almost 5,200 grant applications but were only able to fund 2,201 – less than half of the submissions. Although the total funding requested was \$678 million, FEMA had \$305 million to allocate; a record figure, but not enough to meet rising demands.

In FY2023, there was a 97% increase in NSGP-State applications. The increase of over 1,700 applications was more than FEMA received in the entire program in FY2020. All 55 eligible states and territories applied under NSGP-S for the first time in the history of the program. As we have seen, the need has continued to grow for federal funds, which is expected as the FY2024 NSGP application process unfolds. And with \$274.5 million available in FY2024, \$30.5 million less than last year, many worthy grant applications will not be fulfilled.

Unfortunately, today's threat environment provides a compelling public interest in preventing attacks that would disrupt the vital health, human, social, cultural, religious, and other humanitarian services to society. Such threats terrorize the lives and well-being of millions of Americans who operate, utilize, live, and work in their communities. Accordingly, we respectfully urge you to strengthen the NSGP by properly funding the program at \$385 million in FY2025.
